# Administrator's Report 04/11/22

# Easter Egg Hunt this Saturday in King Jack Park starting at 1pm!



Waste Water crews have been working hard the last several weeks to try and determine the source of a waste water leak that has been causing issues for years at the Senior Center. We have found several old service lines we believe were not capped off properly and are inserting a liner to try and determine which are needed and which can be shut off. This is being done after having done extensive work inside the building thinking it was a faulty trap indoors. We hope this brings good news. Not real sure what can be done beyond this fix.

**Street Department** has been busy with conducting a street inventory in anticipation of summer repair and maintenance. We have several patch repairs already identified but with obvious price increases coming for asphalt we want to be sure we are getting the best use of our overlay funds.



Mulch has arrived! Parks Department crews have restocked all of our park areas with new mulch and are still working to finish the new Stadium View Park. Once the install of equipment and borders are completed the new mulch will be the last step before the new park is to be opened to the public.

Extensive work to the Walnut Ridge lift station continues with an expected completion date of the first of May. Our personnel from public works and Waste Water are completing the work which results in a significant cost savings over having to hire the project out.

Staff have completed the ordinance for repealing the aerial restriction to fireworks and be presenting to council at this meeting.

The recently approved billboard for advertising along MO 249 Highway is scheduled to be completed April 11<sup>th</sup>. Contract was signed and final approvals issued last week.

City Staff are working on a proposal to present to council for an ordinance that would create a **shared access requirement on properties that are located on restricted access roadways**. This issue was brought up recently in some development planning and could be a problem with access to Madison in the future for new developments.

# **Previous Meetings**

Staff met with our **Workers Compensation** Carrier and received news that our premium for the upcoming year has risen 26%. Unfortunately this was not unexpected as our Modification Report has indicated two years running this would happen as our claims have had a couple bad years. The increase in costs for this upcoming year will be approx. \$65,000.

The **composting program** at the waste water plant is gearing up for what looks to be a busy summer. We have already had hauled over 300 ton of soil amendments preparing to start the new season. Many have asked about the stockpiles on the Habitat Property west of 249 and those are just to be spread and applied later this spring.

Community Development and the Webb City Chamber have been working with area merchants to plan a first Thursday event each month the event will be called "Downtown After Dark"

**Public Works** has continued to perform some storm drain maintenance in anticipation of the spring rains and also we have focused on crack sealing areas that have been damaged during the last winter. We are targeting some cut and patch areas for when the weather clears but with the fluctuation in oil prices we will be evaluating any overlays more in the near future.

# AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 205.230 OF THE WEBB CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING THE DISCHARGE OF AERIAL FIREWORKS IN THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Section 205.230 of the Webb City Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage.
