Pinnacle Bank has asked to host a Webb City Employee luncheon next Thursday from 11am to 2pm. This will be held at the Police Department (weather permitting) and they have asked that all council and their families be sure and receive an invite. Please see attached flyer.

The **cost of living adjustment** that was approved within the FY21/22 budget was 2.0% staff has prepared for approval that increase which will be presented at council session. Of course this is well below the more than 5% increase in the SSA COLA adjustment for this year but we have continually for many years granted the COLA above the SSA but this is increase is certainly higher than a normal year.

7th Street Bridge north of chesterfield has been repaired by our Public Works Crews. The work was completed just in time for the rain that came on Thursday morning.





Damage to the compost chip shredder has occurred at the waste water treatment plant. We will be seeking cost estimates and presenting the repairs to council at the next session. This equipment is in heavy use this time of year as many residents are conducting their spring and storm clean up.

City wide Garage Sale and City Wide Spring Cleanup were conducted this year with little to no issues. Our crews have received high praise for assisting in the yearly event now that we have changed it to a curb side project. Staff feels that this process has simplified the cleanup and also helps prevent that illegal dumping that seemed to accompany the event every year.

Planning meetings have continued each week for the start of the 171 Retention Project.

Engineers are to bring forward a contract for design engineering in the next month.

Previous Meetings

Bryan Waggoner has now assumed full duties as the Webb City Park Director. We look forward to his leadership and exciting new ideas as we move into the future with the Webb City Park Department. Please feel free to reach out to him and welcome him in his new duties.

The first **Webb City Chamber membership luncheon** was held last week at Just a Taste last Thursday. The attendance was strong and we look forward to this event continuing into the future.

The rain has obviously been an issue this past week. Webb City has taken many steps in the past years to prevent water from damaging structures and we have seen some improvement in the amount of damage from rains such as we experienced last Wednesday night into Thursday. One home did receive some water damage but that was prior to the heavy rain and determined to have been caused by a clog of "disposable wipes".. That are not really disposable...

Webb City Public Works and Parks Department teamed up and have worked with a contractor to get the two **softball poles and lights replaced** before the start of games on May 7th. We appreciate all the help making this unexpected repair possible before the start of season.

Webb City received **damage on three different bridge structures** during the rainstorm last week. Reported to have only received less than 3 inches of rain but it must have come down so fast it caused damage to some structures that have stood for a very long time. The Bridge at 7th and Chesterfield was closed to traffic but has since been reopened. West Broadway the curb washed out along the bridge and we will need to repair some of the structure on the north side. Zora Street Bridge east of Madison also has some minor wash out and we plan to make repairs as soon as possible. All of them are still usable but we will make these repairs a priority this summer.

One of the **softball fields has a couple light poles that are showing signs of deterioration** and in need of immediate replacement. We have arranged for a contractor to be on site next week who can lift the poles out and then our city electrician will rewire the new poles and move the lights to them. The poles were purchased from Liberty electric and we were thankful to them because our only other option would have been to wait an unknown amount of time for delivery. We hope to have the poles and field lights replaced by the time games start on May 7th.

City staff will be seeking bids on **replacement of the Mining Days Building Roof**. This is the original roof and has been showing signs lately that it needs replaced soon.

Webb City **Fire Department responded to a structure fire on N. Walker** last Tuesday and the structure received extensive damage. City staff will be working with the owners and code enforcement to clear the site of any danger as soon as possible.

If you get a chance go see the new billboard advertising Webb City on North bound 249 in front of the John Deer location now!

City Staff are working on a proposal to present to council for an ordinance that would create a **shared access requirement on properties that are located on restricted access roadways**. This issue was brought up recently in some development planning and could be a problem with access to Madison in the future for new developments.

2022 COLA WAGE INCREASE

SUBJECT/BACKGROUND:

The City uses the Social Security Administration's annual cost of living adjustment as a guideline for our COLA wage increases. The City usually gives a slightly higher adjustment than SSA but in October 2021 the SSA issued a 5.9 % COLA increase for 2022 benefits. The City included a 2.0% increase in the 2021-2022 budget.

Staff recommends implementing the 2% COLA for all city employees starting with the first payroll in June.

The 2021 - 2022 budget includes approximately \$48,000 for COLA increases.

Mechanical Repairs to Limb Shredder at Compost Project

5-23-2022

SUBJECT:

Mechanical repair to the limb shredder at the compost project.

BACKGROUND:

The limb shredder at the compost project received damage several months ago due to a large piece metal being mixed in with the limbs and being dumped into the shredder. Staff made repairs and believed all to be good. However it has become apparent that more damage was done than what was initially believed. Several major parts need to be replaced and the factory service technician will need to realign the conveyor frame and discharge belt to be operational again.

COST:

A quote from Modern Tech Equipment (the regional supplier for this brand of shredder) was submitted for \$23,852.48 for replacement parts and labor.

IMPACT & EFFECT:

The current budget allows \$30,000 for Equipment/Maintenance Repairs (41.86.46810). This expense added to the year to date sum totals slightly over \$30,000.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends proceeding with the repairs from Modern Tech Equipment at a cost of \$23,852.48


