# Administrator's Report 07/28/2025

**The time has come!** Monday July 28<sup>th</sup> at 4:30pm the new "W Club" Recreation Center will officially open to the public. The Webb City Parks Department and the entire City of Webb City will be forever grateful to the Dawson Heritage Foundation for their most generous donation.

Parks staff have been busy putting together schedules and procedures for the public to utilize the facility. I have attached a DRAFT of what we expect to start with. There will be a membership process that the public will need to follow. It will be free to sign up and use during open gym hours. We are sure that things will change and adjust as we learn what works and does not work as time goes along.

## W Club Schedule

The W Club will have open gym times that will allow family and friends to come and play on the court. No scrimmages or organized team activities of any kind will be allowed during these designated times, unless reserved ahead of time. No paid personal training will be allowed as well during this time. The Webb City Parks and Recreation highly encourages a family friendly atmosphere where guests can come improve their skills or enjoy friendly competition. **Fire Department reports their first Fire Academy** to have been a success with five of the first seven graduates' passing their State practical tests and we anticipate the remaining two to retest and pass next week. (Update: all have now passed their Missouri State tests!)

**Roads are prepped and ready**. We anticipate the pavers to be in town next week to complete the second round of paving which consists of the major streets being Webb Street and 4<sup>th</sup> Street.

Our crews have completed their work to prepare the **Westhaven Park new playground** site. We anticipate the vendor to be on site next week to install the new playground.

We would like to **thank the Fire Department** for their assistance in keeping the grass at the new W Club watered. They have been bringing water to the site each morning to make sure the grass has the best opportunity to survive in this recent heat.

Our Public Works Water crews have submitted plan sand applications to replace the long needed water line on Tom Street from Cook Street to Galena Street. This will greatly reduce any future leaks and remove the very undersized pipe and replace it with a new 6inch main that will help with water pressure in that area. This is just a continuation of their aggressive approach to enhance and maintain our city wide system. This will not been easy project but our crews are more than

# **Previous Meetings**

The Joplin Trails Coalition announced last week that they have issued a contract for the first phase of the walking trail to be constructed on city owned property on North Madison. This eventually will be a walking trail across Center Creek to allow trail enthusiasts to connect to the North to the Ruby Jack Trail. Maps will be available at the meeting.

**Newly printed and bound, council approved, Employee Handbooks** are in and in process of being distributed. Each employee will be required to sign an acknowledgement and receipt for the new manuals.

Much discussion and testing has taken place regarding any levels of toxicity within the fish at all of our city owned lakes. It is good to report so far all tests have come back with no concerning levels of any heavy metals or toxins. We are working with DNR and the Department of Conservation to determine what the best fishing ordinance we can come up with regarding catch and release or harvest limits at our lakes. The MDC plans to host several fishing and children events at our lakes soon and will be determining how to best stock the lakes.

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Waste water crews have been working to install a couple new manholes in locations determined to have been found to have issues because of very long runs. Once that is complete we will be focusing on some major maintenance projects that will include removing roots and other obstructions in the entire system.

Parks Department would like to extend a thank you to our Habitat Division for their continued assistance this year bringing the large winged tractor and brush hog to the park. This has really relieved some of the staff mowing time.

Waste Water received a report of a manhole overflow last Sunday afternoon. Upon arrival our crews located a rather large grease clog within the main line. We suspect one of the local businesses must have a grease trap malfunctioning or just in need of maintenance. Staff will be contacting and inspecting those in the area in the near future. If not for information being passed to our crews and their quick response we could have had a much larger issue to deal with than we had.

Water crews continue to locate and repair water leaks and it certainly is working because here we are in June and our water loss is definitely improved and the MOAM valve is still throttled back.

Parks department have had a need for a small building in the softball complex for storage and also and air-conditioned area for the officials to relax between games. Muskrat Roofing has volunteered to build the building if we can provide the materials. Little League has also agreed to donate \$1,500 of the costs which are estimated at \$5,000.

Community Development has been working with **Wow Printing to complete the design for the mural next to the 66 Event center and the addition of Route 66 signage** along Daugherty at the large concrete trestles. We hope to have them ready for council approval soon as we move forward in this project that was approved in the FY 24/25 budget.

You will now find in the council packet each meeting the last two weeks building permits that have been issued by Public Works. This is the result of a recent request that the information be provided but one can still find all permits issued at the Public Works office on North Madison anytime during working hours.

Staff met with our workers comp and it looks like after a couple good years we will be seeing a \$100,000 reduction this year in our cost. We continue to focus on safe work practices

and our Safety Committee is continuing to meet regularly to discuss improvements as we find them in all departments.

The Webb City Fire Department responded to a total of 1154 calls for service during the month. See attached sheet for breakdown information.

We are continuing to work on the new training facility; we will be ready to paint it sometime in the next few weeks and then we will be ready to have the dedication with the Chamber hopefully by the end of August.

All the recruits from the training academy have taken their State exams and I am pleased to announce that all 7 recruits who have passed are now State certified as Fire I & II firefighters. I am happy with their work, and with Deputy Chief Denton and his effort to make this a success.

We will be meeting with the area departments to discuss next year's academy and how we can improve it and make it fit the needs of our surrounding departments.

We are assisting with watering the new grass at the W Club.

We are taking precautions with our calls during this extreme heat to assure safety for our firefighters and the customers we are responding to.

148 hours of department training and 2 hours of Public Relations have been conducted, and we continue to assist the other departments in the city as needed.



Grinder Rental for Compost Program 7-28-2025

#### **SUBJECT:**

It is once again time to take the limb shredding and do a second grind to reduce the size. This will condense the grindings to free up much needed storage space and will also produce a better product for the compost as well as for the mulch that is used in the parks. We have obtained bids from two private companies who can come on site to perform the additional grinding of the materials. Funds are budgeted for this project.

Hansens Tree Service \$650 Hr. rate for grinder. \$200 Hr. rate for loader.

\$850 Hr. total. Additional \$850 mobilization fee for

grinder and \$450 fee for loader.

Smithley Environmental \$600 Hr. rate for grinder including 1 loader.

Additional \$1,500 mobilization fee

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends Smithley Environmental for 50 hours for grinding of material cost not to exceed \$31,500 total including the mobilization fee.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**
