Administrator's Report 08/08/22

City staff have been busy working on a new web site. The current site has had some issues and made it very difficult to make changes. We are wanting to incorporate some additional features such as online bill pay and permit applications. It will still be located at the same domain of www.webbcitymo.org and we hope to announce the unveiling very soon.

Public Works crews have been busy keeping up with all the demands **new construction has placed on the water system.** Last Tuesday they installed a new main on East Street that will serve the new Flat Creek Grill then on Tuesday the 9th we will be installing two new water main service connections for new housing at the intersection of 3rd and Oronogo.



Lights are up on the new youth soccer field in King Jack Park located where the rodeo once was. Public works and Parks crews have been busy smoothing out the ground and are now hoping to get some rain so seeding can begin. If all goes well it is possible the field will be in use this fall.

The portable office should be in place the first of next week at the entrance to the Waste Water treatment plant. The ground has been cleared off and gravel put in place to help with the dust. Electric installation is planned soon after the building is in place. The gate has been upgraded to allow remote access as we work to **move the recycle bins to this location.** Once there we hope to be able to monitor them and keep contaminants to a minimum.

City staff would like to welcome LeeAnn Crider who has been named as the new Executive Director of the Webb City Area Chamber of Commerce. LeeAnn had served as the assistant to Gwynn Allen who announced her retirement last month. LeeAnn met with the Webb City/Carl Junction Rotary this week to introduce herself and provide some insight to her plans as she begins her tenure as Executive Director. Stop by and welcome her to her new position at the Route 66 Chamber Office.

Previous Meetings

The **ordinance change regarding the approval of short term rental properties** will be on the August 15th agenda for the Planning and Zoning Commission to approve since it deals with a change in zoning procedures. Upon approval from the commission it is planned to be presented to City Council at August 22nd meeting.

(Will be presented to planning and zoning on August 15th)

Grand opening for Zips Car Wash was held on Thursday morning at their new location on Madison. I appreciate all who took time out of their day to welcome the new development to our great city. If you have not heard, they are offering a \$1.00 car wash all weekend to let people get acquainted with their service.

We did have Pryor Track come **inspect the Trolley track** and after a few minor repairs to some of the spikes and ties it was determined safe to run the trolley again.

RFQ (Request for Qualifications) for engineering services has been issued regarding the proposed **171 Retention project**. The design engineering which was paid for at 80% is now complete. Once the RFQ's have been evaluated and decision made as to engineering firm, staff will be presenting a project plan to council for the use of ARP funds to fund the entire project from this point forward. Construction Engineer requests for qualifications will be opened and evaluated in August with hopes of selecting an engineering company before September.

Planning and Zoning approved the request by Tee Time Golf LLC for a Special Use Permit to operate a golf facility in the Centennial Retail District. That SUP will be presented to council at this meeting for approval.

Our current **solid waste contracted residential price** is \$9.48 per residence. The contract that was signed and agreed upon included a 1.5% fuel surcharge increase for every 10 cents of increase above a baseline of \$3.50 per gallon. The addendum allowed a maximum of a 10% increase during the life of the contract. **Our contractor has agreed to a lesser amount at total of 5% (47cents)** increase to be enforced for every 30 day period that the average gallon of diesel fuel remains over \$5.00. This is to begin starting the next billing cycle with the Webb City Water Department. This surcharge if approved would remain in effect until the US monthly average per gallon of diesel falls below \$5.00 for a 30 day period.

A resolution to support the **Centennial Park TAP sidewalk project** will be presented to council at this next meeting. The drawing presented last week detailed what we have planned and staff will be applying for a MODOT award to cover 75% of the costs of the project.

The **Police Department now has three speed trailers** after the addition of two new ones. These were sought after and received on a grant by the Police Department. They will be deployed in areas where speeding has been an issue. If you have any suggestions for additional locations please do not hesitate to let us know.

City staff have been working closely with Flat Creek contractors to assure this development moves smoothly. We really appreciate the quick response from Public Works for moving a street light that was in the way and replacing it. We have also met with the developers for some of the other projects within the Centennial TDD and they also appear to be moving forward. The next year to 18 months should prove to be very exciting.

The city has been notified that the **Missouri Public Service Commission has granted Liberty Electric a rate increase in excess of 7%**. This evidently triggers a state statute that requires municipalities to reduce their business license tax on gross receipts to below the 7% increase. Staff will be researching and will bring forward to council the required changes.

City staff will **be advertising the Webb City Club House for a possible lease** partner who would want to occupy the building and help with maintenance and utility costs. Currently the building is vacant and all efforts to occupy it to date have failed.

City Staff are working on a proposal to present to council for an ordinance that would create a **shared access requirement on properties that are located on restricted access roadways**. This issue was brought up recently in some development planning and could be a problem with access to Madison in the future for new developments.

Community Development and the Webb City Chamber have been working with area merchants to plan a first Thursday event each month the event will be called “Downtown After Dark”

The Webb City Fire Department responded to a total of 146 calls for service during the month. See attached sheet for breakdown information.

We are continuing training on our new reporting software. It has been going well and I anticipate that we will be using all the functions and completely switched over by the end of summer.

We have partnered with some area departments to begin a regional training academy to train new hires for the position of firefighters. This program just started this month and hopefully it will create a new avenue for us to recruit firefighters.

I have suspended outside burning permits until we get adequate rain.

We have been attending public events and doing fire safety education.

Business inspections and hydrant testing is going well.

250 hours of department training and 40 hours of Public Relations has been conducted and we continue to assist the other departments in the city as needed.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A CERTAIN TRACT OF REAL ESTATE WITHIN THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI (BRIAN HARRIS, 502 SOUTH BALL, WEBB CITY, MO 64870).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. By action of the City Council, a Special Use Permit is hereby granted for the following described real estate: 510 W. 5th Street, Webb City, Missouri, being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

ALL OF LOT NUMBERED THIRTY-SEVEN (37) AND THIRTY-EIGHT (38) IN HOUGH'S ADDITION TO THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, JASPER COUNTY, MISSOURI.

SECTION 2. The terms and conditions of the Special Use Permit granted in Section 1 above are as follows, to-wit:

- A. Said Special Use Permit shall be personal to BRIAN HARRIS and shall not be assigned
- B. The use upon said real estate is for the purpose of operating a short-term rental property which is a rental period of less than 30 days.
- C. Except as specifically modified herein, permittee shall fully comply with and conform to the requirements of the existing zoning district and all other ordinances of the City of Webb City, Missouri.
- D. Failure to comply with any of these conditions or restrictions constitutes a violation of this chapter, punishable as provided in Section 405.530 of the City Code of Webb City.
- E. Permittee shall comply with all Federal, State and Local laws and regulations required to operate a warehouse and fulfillment center, including all licensing requirements and regulations.
- F. Said Special Use Permit shall extend for a period of two (2) years from passage of this Ordinance, unless revoked for non-compliance with the conditions or restrictions imposed herein.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to annotate said Special Use Permit upon the Zoning Map of the City of Webb City, Missouri, and the City Clerk

is hereby authorized to issue, upon proper application, the City Business License that conforms to the Special Use Permit heretofore granted.

SECTION 4. Violation of any of the provisions of the Special Use Permit shall result in revocation thereof.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A CERTAIN TRACT OF REAL ESTATE WITHIN THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI (KELLEN GRANTHAM, TEE TIME, LLC, 1021 RUSTIC RIDGE, JOPLIN, MO 64804).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. By action of the City Council, a Special Use Permit is hereby granted for the following described real estate: South of Daugherty Street and West of East Street in Webb City, Missouri, being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Legal description attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. The terms and conditions of the Special Use Permit granted in Section 1 above are as follows, to-wit:

A. Said Special Use Permit shall be personal to Kellen Grantham and Tee Time, LLC and shall not be assigned, provided that Kellen Grantham and Tee Time, LLC may lease the premises to a Third Party operating a business consistent with the terms and conditions of this Special Use Permit.

B. The use upon said real estate is for the purpose of operating a TopGolf style golfing and entertainment facility including food and beverage service, pickle ball courts and other recreational activities.

C. Except as specifically modified herein, permittee shall fully comply with and conform to the requirements of the existing zoning district and all other ordinances of the City of Webb City, Missouri.

D. Failure to comply with any of these conditions or restrictions constitutes a violation of this chapter, punishable as provided in Section 405.530 of the City Code of Webb City.

E. Permittee shall comply with all Federal, State and Local laws and regulations required to operate a golfing and entertainment facility, including all health and licensing requirements.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to annotate said Special Use Permit upon the Zoning Map of the City of Webb City, Missouri, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to issue, upon proper application, the City Business License that conforms to the Special Use Permit heretofore granted.

SECTION 4. Violation of any of the provisions of the Special Use Permit shall result in revocation thereof.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage.

SUBJECT:

The Police Department is seeking the Council's approval to accept \$80,703.09 in grant funding from the Missouri Department of Transportation.

BACKGROUND:

The Missouri Department of Transportation will fully fund saturation patrols (driving while intoxicated wolf packs) and hazardous moving violation enforcement patrols from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023. Funding awarded for saturation patrols is \$26,568.70 and \$54,134.39 for hazardous moving violation enforcement patrols. The City of Webb City is not required to provide any matching funds to claim this award.

RECOMMENDATION:
